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Comment: To the Board, SCTA and SCUSD,

As a parent of children who have been in SCUSD for nearly 10 years, I am weary. Weary of the ongoing and long term disputes between the SCTA and the district. Weary of arguments over budgets. Weary over the tension between those who are leading the district (SCTA, school board and the district alike) who use our children as pawns for political posturing and money.

The SCTA has stated that they do not exist for the interest of the students. The district, despite its best intentions, are unable to open the doors of the schools. Who, then will fight for our children? Who has our children's best interests in mind? You have a duty to our children and taxpayers. Duty to spend tax money wisely and for the good of our children.

SCUSD's last day of normalcy was March 13, 2020. 43,000 children have not received, full time, in person instruction for 15 months. That's 450 days. They've lost time with their peers. They've lost time building relationships with their teachers. They've stared at screens for months, if they bother to log on or turn on their screens. They've lost community. They've lost interest in learning.

With vaccines widely available and all other governing authorities indicating it is safe to return to school, SCUSD needs to follow the science and return to full time instruction. Every other school district in the greater Sacramento area has committed to full time, in person instruction in the fall. Most, if not all have already returned at least 4 days a week. Meanwhile, SCUSD students get two days with no concrete plan for the fall. This is unacceptable.

Parents are frustrated and have had enough. Enrollment will continue to decline as parents with means will move to private schools. You know this. Do you care?
