Whereas access to quality information is a critical step toward addressing disparities

Whereas despite historic declines, the United States lags behind comparable countries in providing parents

Whereas young people aged 15-24 in the United States are disproportionately affected by the HIV/AIDS epidemic;

Whereas young people under 25 are disproportionately affected by HIV/AIDS;

Whereas three-quarters of LGBT youth have experienced harassment and nearly a third skipped at least one day of school due to concerns for their safety;

Whereas approximately 1 in 3 LGBT youth have experienced emotional, or verbal abuse from family members;

Whereas sex education that includes information about consent, sexual intercourse, increase condom use, and reduce rates of unintended pregnancy among young people, and decrease rates of HIV/AIDS;

Whereas young people who receive comprehensive sex education are less likely to become pregnant or have an unintended pregnancy, 31 percent more likely to delay sexual activity until they are ready, and 13 percent more likely to use a condom during sexual intercourse;

Whereas sex education provides information about the prevention, treatment, and care of
