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# CDPH Update

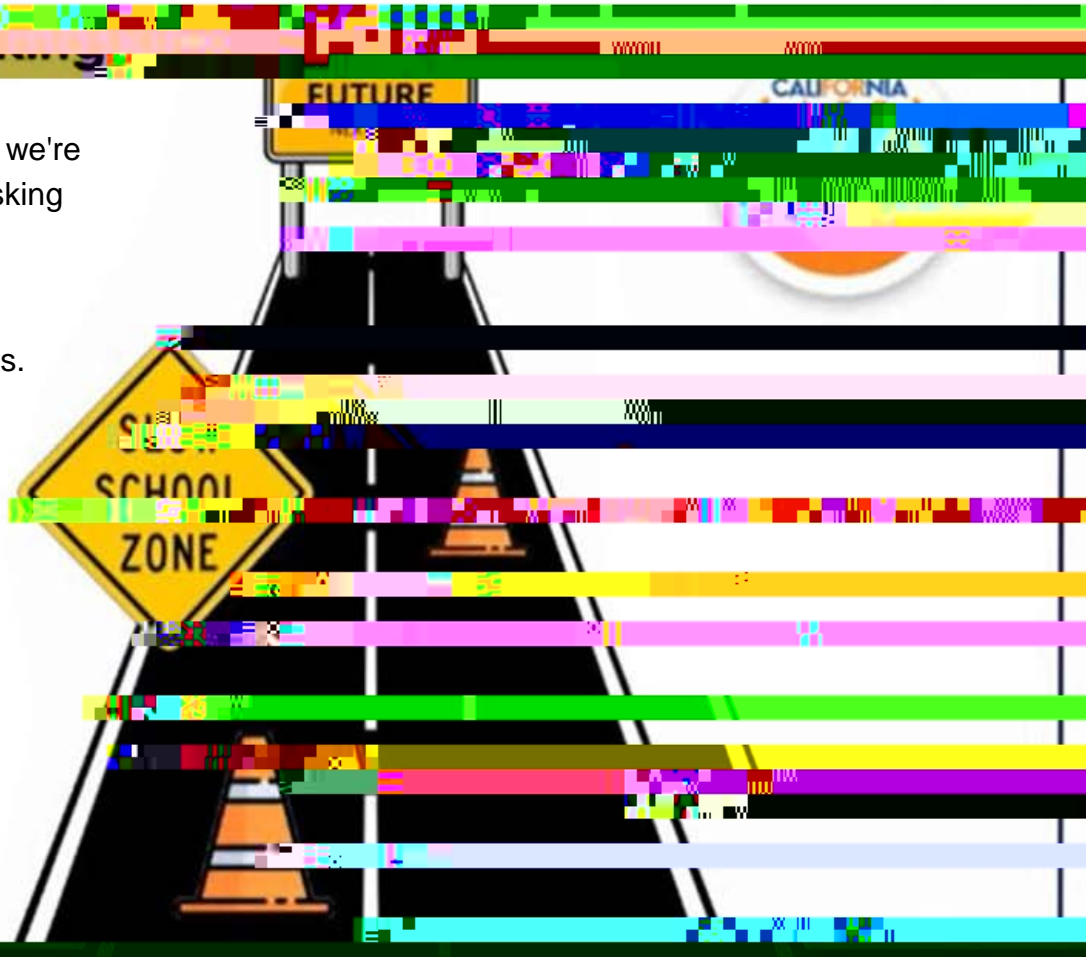
Based on our data, it is reasonable that we're getting close to a point where state masking requirements can be relaxed.

No change to school masking requirement

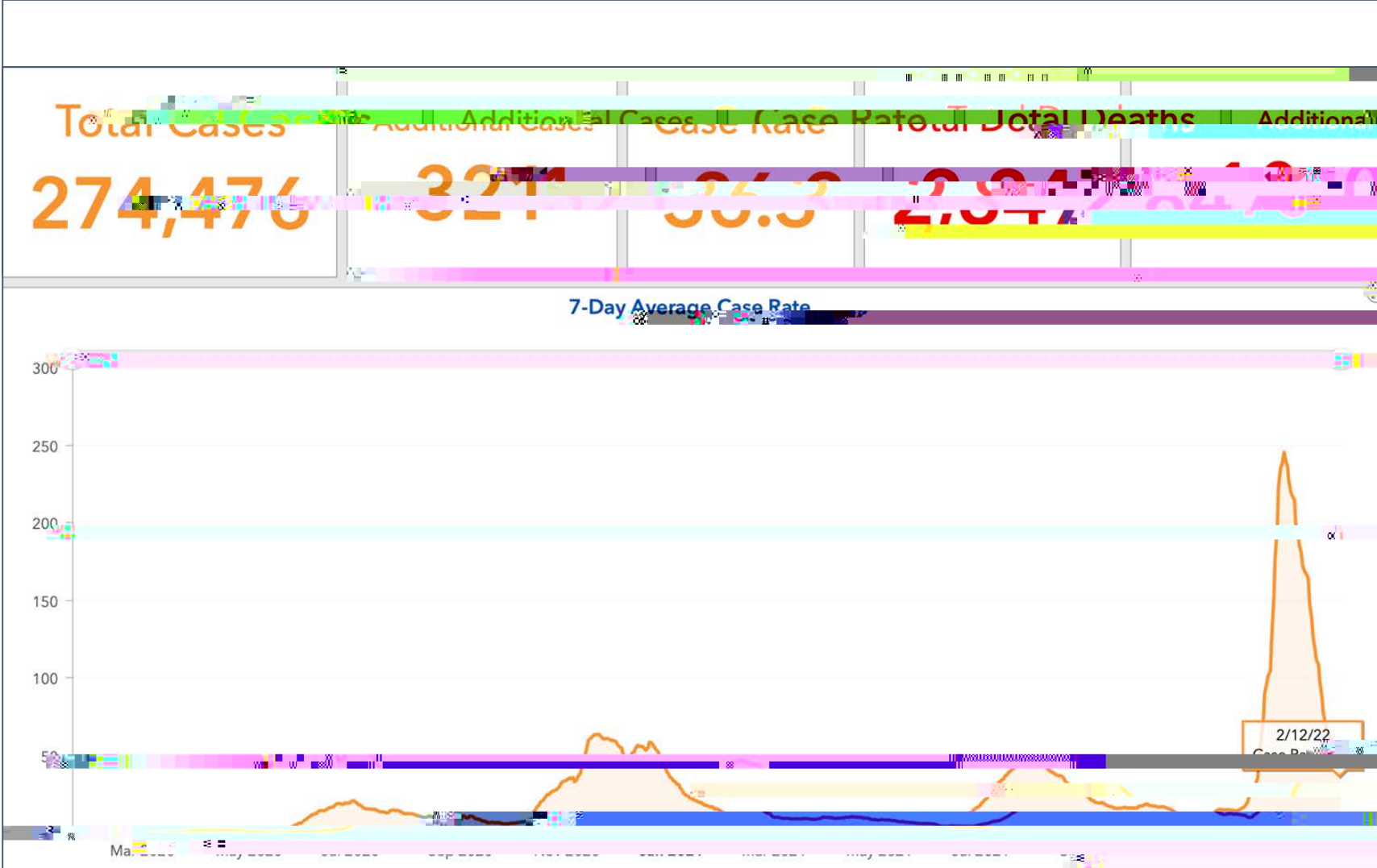


School Masking still required

36.3 cases per 100k residents

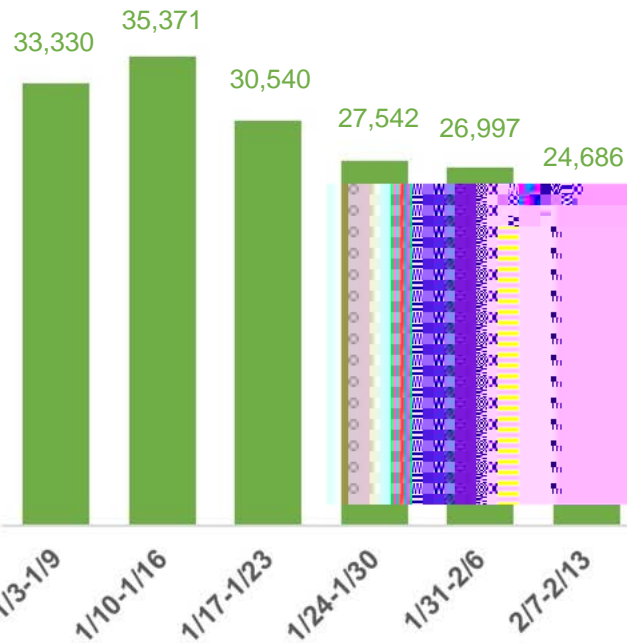
33.9% positivity rate last week



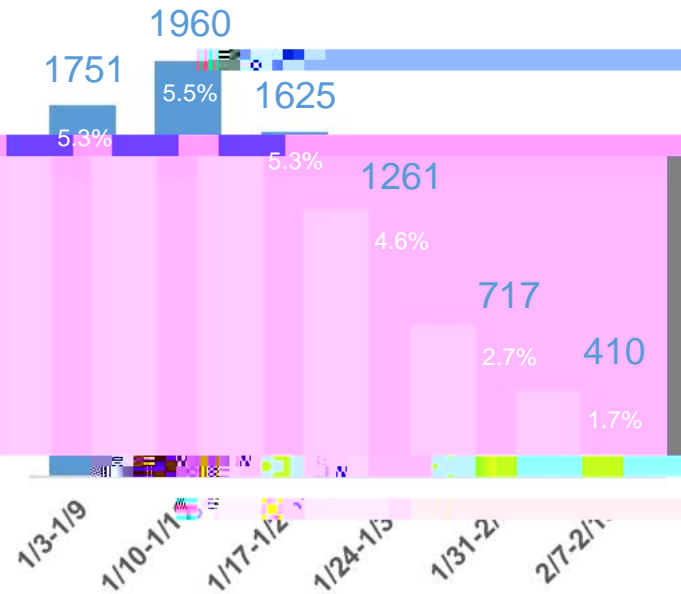

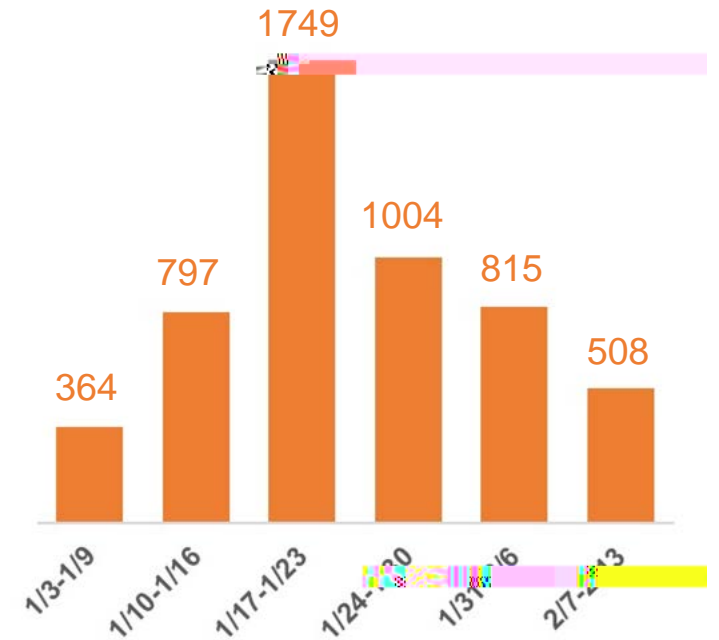
# COVID-19 Tests Provided



# of positive tests for staff & students [positivity rate]



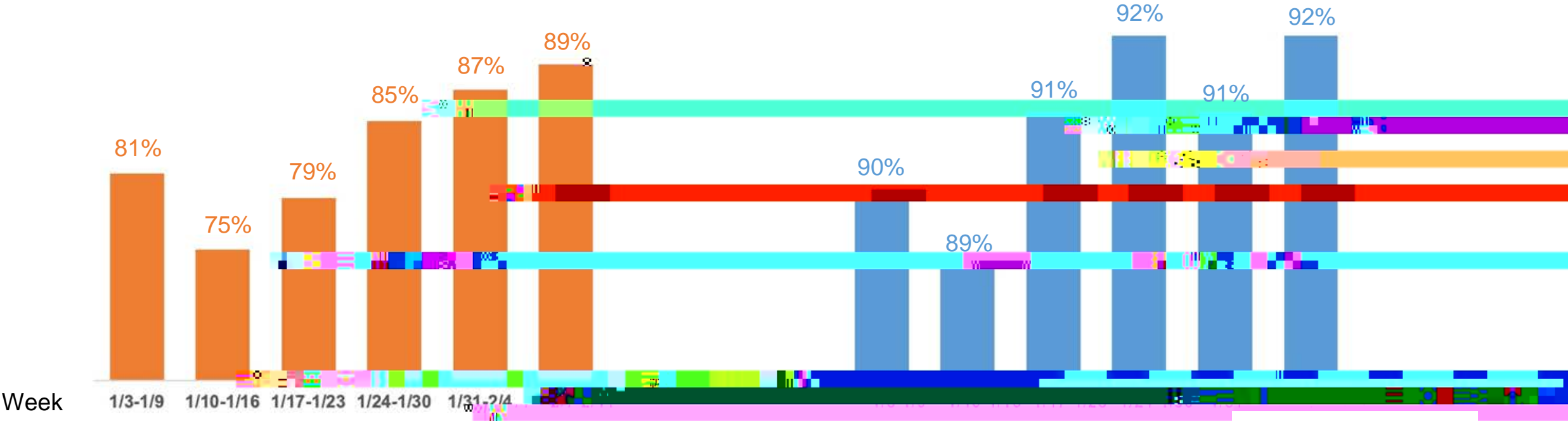
# of positive COVID-19 cases present at school/work during infectious period

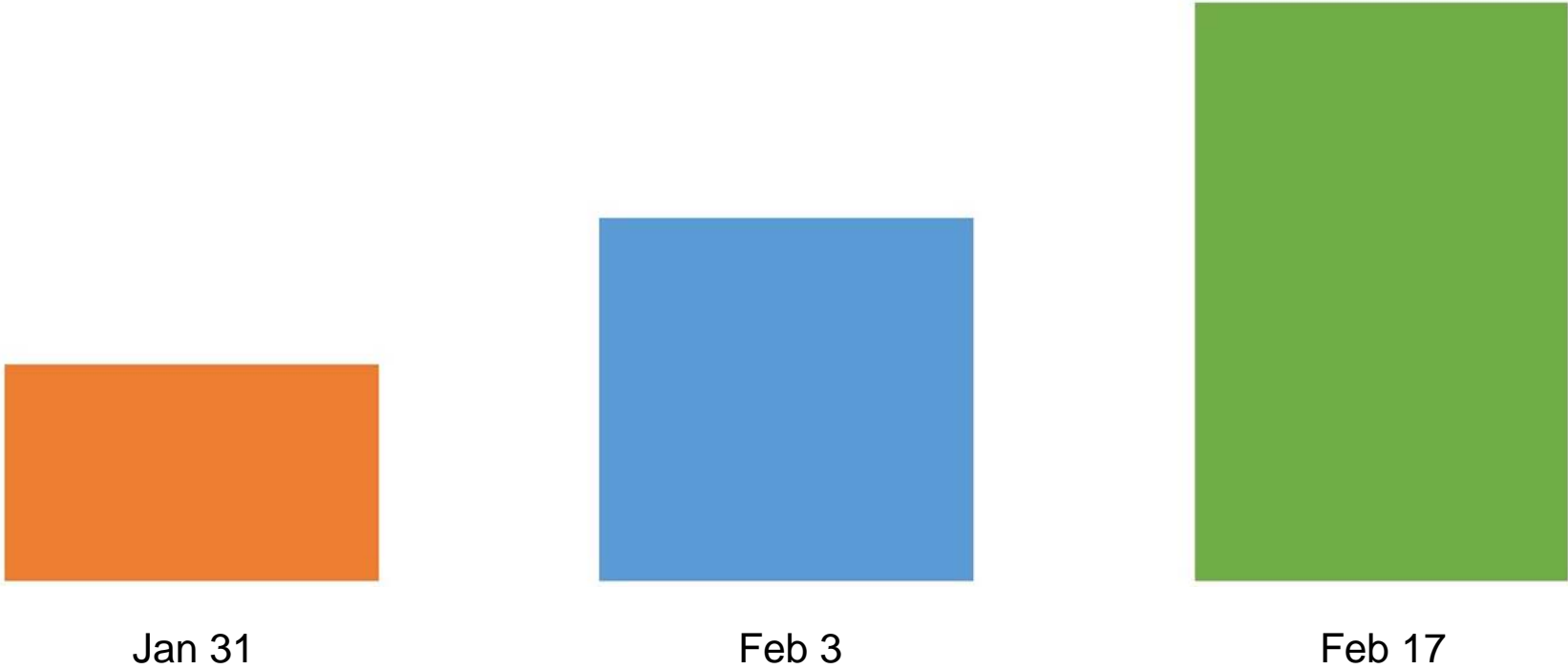


# COVID-19 Student Vaccination Status Dashboard

# COVID-19 Student Vaccination Progress

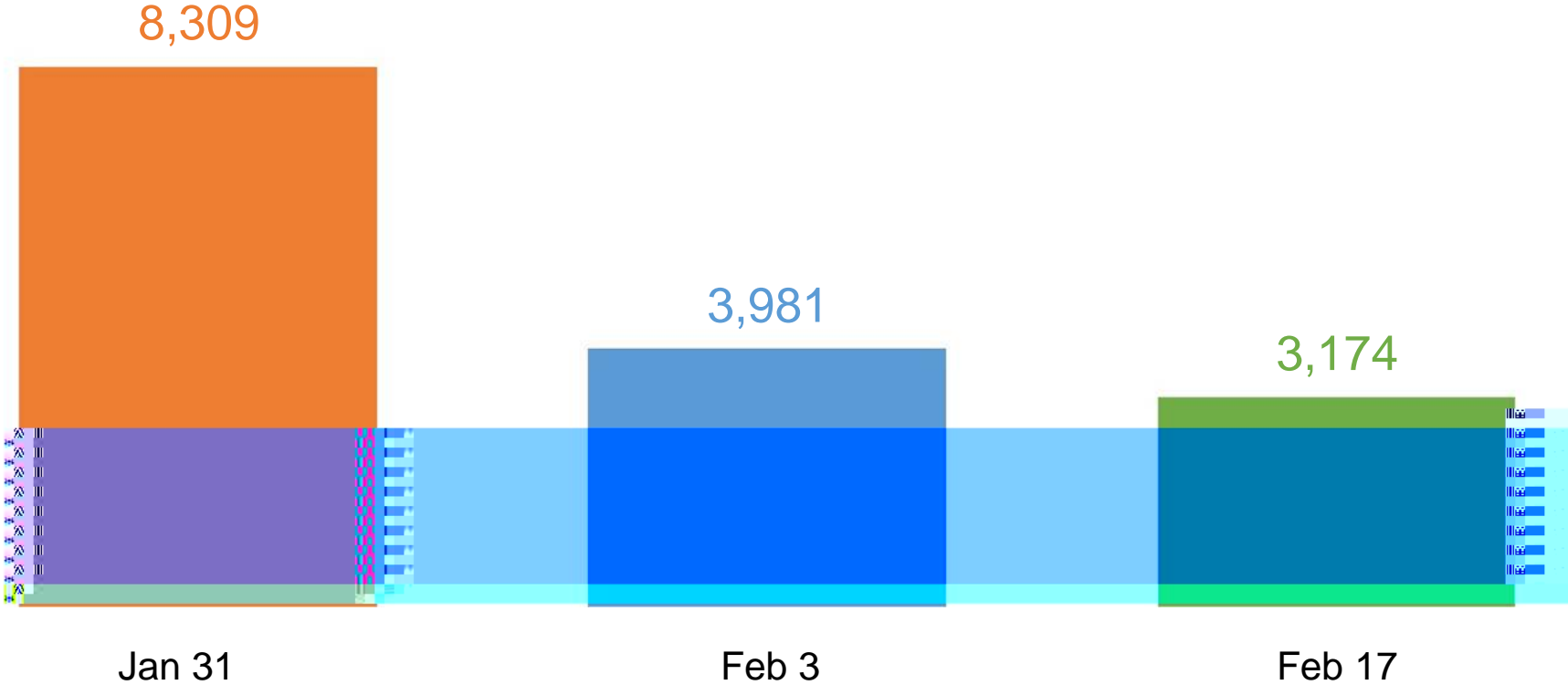

Communicate vaccination mandate impact on staffing and services to students and families

Continue consulting with SCPH on fluidity of public health guidelines & revise plans in response

On February 28, CDPH will announce an update on lifting K-12 required mitigation measures. Should lifting of mitigation measures be associated to vaccination rates, the District will extend the vaccine or testing implementation deadline to the March 3, 2022 Board meeting for a final deadline recommendation.
