**Subject:** Integrated Support Services Update



## I. Overview/History

The SCUSD Integrated Support Services (ISS) provides a wide range of social, emotional, and behavioral support services to students, staff, and the community. ISS leverages the resources of the district, including universities, internships, and community organizations. ISS offers a variety of services, including health, youth development, and career counseling.

Since 2010, The Cal State Long Beach Center for Community Engagement has become an important partner in providing change within and among students and children.

The SCUSD Integrated Support Services has been in existence for more than 30 years.

## III. Budget

In the 2012-13 fiscal year, the budget for ISS is approximately \$1.5 million.
