



Sacramento City Unified School District will hold a community bullying prevention training at Sutter Middle School tonight -- October 10 -- which is also Unity Day, a national event to promote tolerance.

October is National Bullying Prevention Month.

The training tonight -- the second in a series of five -- is free and open to anyone in the community who wants to learn more about keeping kids safe at school and in cyberspace.

SCUSD launched a district-wide crackdown on bullying in June 2011 when the Board of Education approved a sweeping new anti-bullying policy. At the trainings, parents can learn how to identify bullying behaviors and what to do if their child is being bullied.
